
- Forecast track has shifted westward overnight
- Tropical Storm Watches now from San Luis Pass to High Island, TS Warnings from High Island east across Louisiana Coast
- Tropical Storm Watch includes Chambers, Galveston, Harris and Liberty Counties, Galveston Bay and adjacent coastal waters
- Expected impacts: locally heavy rain and gusty winds mainly east of track
- System currently with max winds 40 mph, not expected to intensify much

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Forecast track has shifted slightly west Tropical Storm Watch now from San Luis Pass to **High Island** TS Warning E



Earliest Reasonable Arrival of TS Winds

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
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Based on different scenarios, TS force winds could arrive as early as early Wednesday morning

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Most Likely Arrival Time of TS Winds

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
Based on different scenarios, most likely arrival time of **TS force winds** during day Wednesday afternoon or evening

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Forecast Rainfall (Track Dependent)

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Will highly depend on track; rainfall 3 to 6 inches mainly east of the track, much lesser amounts west of track (sharp gradient)

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
Storm Surge, Tides

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Surge & Tides

HIGHLY UNCERTAIN!

- Dependent on whether we end up on the east or west side of the disturbance.
- Areas east of center track could see surge 1 to 2 feet, water levels 4 to 5 feet above MLLW
- □ Water rise starting Wed afternoon
- Areas west of track could receive lower tides, low water conditions possibly






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Potential Tropical Cyclone Three

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Seas □Increasing to =>7 feet within 20 NM by Wednesday morning



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- Tropical Storm Watch includes Chambers, Galveston, Harris and Liberty Counties, Galveston Bay and adjacent coastal waters
- Expected impacts: locally heavy rain, gusty winds, elevated tides mainly east of track
- System currently with max winds 40 mph, not expected to intensify much (45 mph)

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
