
Tropical Storm Harvey



- **□** Advisory Time: 7 pm CDT, 8/27/2017
- ☐ **Position:** 28.9N 96.8W
- ☐ Winds: 40 mph sustained w/ higher gusts
- ☐ Movement: SSE 3 mph
- ☐ Comments:
 - Tropical Storm Harvey is forecast to meander south of Matagorda Bay Tuesday, then back to the northeast closer to the metro area toward midweek.
 - ☐ Catastrophic rainfall and flooding will persist for several days.
 - ☐ Unfavorable marine conditions are expected through at least midweek along the upper Texas coast.




Official 7 pm NHC Forecast






Official NHC Forecast




Upper Texas Coastal Waters Forecast 0-20NM

Tuesday Night	tropical storm conditions possible. Southeast winds 30 to 40 knots becoming south 30 to 35 knots after midnight. Gusts to 50 knots. Seas 9 to 12 feet with occasional seas up to 15 feet. Showers and thunderstorms likely.
Wednesday	tropical storm conditions possible. Showers and thunderstorms likely.
Wednesday Night	Southwest winds 20 to 25 knots. Seas 5 to 7 feet with occasional seas up to 8 feet. Showers and thunderstorms likely.
Thursday	Southwest winds 20 to 25 knots decreasing to 15 to 20 knots in the afternoon. Seas 4 to 6 feet with occasional seas up to 7 feet. A chance of showers and thunderstorms.
Thursday Night	South winds 15 to 20 knots decreasing to 10 to 15 knots after midnight. Seas 2 to 4 feet. A chance of showers and thunderstorms.
Friday	South winds 10 to 15 knots increasing to 15 to 20 knots in the afternoon. Seas 2 to 4 feet. A chance of showers and thunderstorms.
Friday Night	South winds 10 to 15 knots. Seas 2 to 3 feet. A chance of showers and thunderstorms.

Concerned with coastal flooding with levels generally above 3 feet MLLW






Summary of Marine Impacts

Tropical Storm forecast by NHC to again impact the upper Texas coast



Winds and seas remain elevated much of the week for the mid and upper coast.



- RIP CURRENTS
 Break the Grip of the Rip!

 Large surf & strong rip currents
 - Large surf.
 - □ Strong rip currents.
 - Beach erosion.
- Periods of rain/storms.
- Tornadoes and waterspouts possible in spiral bands mainly on the right side of the track
- Prolonged heavy/flooding rain a good possibility. Spans several days.
- River/bayou flooding and elevated water levels into early next week.
- Will make for challenging maritime navigation.



Coastal flood risk continues for the upper coast.

Expect unsettled conditions along the upper Texas coast well into midweek!
